

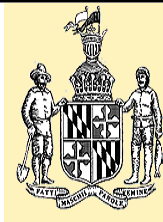

## MISSION

The Career and Technology Education Advisory Council of the Baltimore County Public Schools serves as advisor, advocate, and reviewer for Career and Technology Education Programs which prepare learners academically, technically, and interpersonally for careers and lifelong learning.



## GOALS

The council serves to provide advice and support to the Baltimore County Public Schools Career & Technology Education (CTE) Coordinator and CTE instructional offices as plans are developed and implemented for the continuous improvement of CTE programming. Using the BCPS *Blueprint for Progress* and CTE office's goals for direction, the CTEAC is focused on the following goals for 2011:

- Increasing career and lifelong educational opportunities of our students through rigorous and relevant CTE programs.
- Providing guidance for maximizing human, capital, and material resources to enhance CTE programs.



## MEETINGS & ACTIVITIES

### Quarterly Meetings

The council meets on the first Monday of September, December, March, and June.

### Special Budget Meetings

The council provides public comment and input supporting CTE initiatives at Baltimore County Board of Education and Baltimore County Government.

### Annual Student Recognition Dinner

The council sponsors an annual student awards dinner, recognizing the outstanding achievements of CTE high school seniors. Annual CTE education scholarships are awarded by the council.

### Annual Site Visit

The council sponsors an annual CTE program/industry site visit.

## STRUCTURE

The council is comprised of dedicated citizens representing a wide range of Baltimore County businesses and community groups. Volunteer members commit to a minimum 3-year term.

The council solicits participation from individuals representing businesses in the following *Maryland Career Clusters and CTE program pathways*:

- Arts, Media, and Communication
- Business Management & Finance
- Construction and Development
- Consumer Service, Hospitality, & Tourism
- Environmental, Agricultural, and Natural Resources Systems

- Manufacturing, Engineering, and Technology
- Transportation Technologies.
