Enrollment Information

Classes will be filled on a first come, first served basis and have a minimum enrollment of 15 students to be held. Parents/ guardians and students will be notified if a class is cancelled. Only BCPS students may register May 4 – June 18 at their **home school**. Late registration for BCPS students will be held on June 24, 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. at the **summer school site**. There is no guarantee that students who wait until June 19 will be able to attend summer school. All non-BCPS students must have a signed registration form from the principal of their home school and will be registered on a space available basis. They may register at the summer school site on June 24, 6:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. **FULL** payment is required at registration.

Important Registration Information

From May 4– June 18 registration forms must be completed by the home school. Forms require the signature of the home school principal or his/her designee. **Forms for late registration** are available at high schools and must be signed by the home school principal or his/her designee and brought to registration on June 24 at the summer school site. Non-public school students may acquire a registration form from the nearest public high school. The non-public school principal must sign the registration form.

☞ Payment by check, money order, MasterCard or Visa must accompany completed, signed registration form.

No personal checks accepted at late registration. Waivers will be granted for families who have met the qualifications for reduced/free cost lunches (50%), or medical assistance (100%-with a copy of an active MA card with the correct number). Non-Baltimore County residents are **not** eligible for waivers.

(Checks returned by the bank for insufficient funds will be reported to the State's Attorney, if collection fails.)

☞ Payment is to be submitted with registration form to the Summer School Office, 9610 Pulaski Park Drive, Suite 219, Baltimore MD, 21220 between May 4 and June 18.

☞ After June 18 the payment with the fully completed and signed registration form, **must** be submitted at late registration on June 24 at the summer school site from 9:00 a.m. -12:00 p.m. or 4:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. Non-public school students register June 24 between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. at the summer school site.

Additional Course Offerings (Must be referred by principal)

ESOL: Classes are designed for students with beginning and intermediate English proficiency levels whose first language is not English. Students will practice listening, speaking, reading, and writing English. The selected sites are **Cockeysville MS, Perry Hall MS, New Town HS, General John Stricker MS, and Windsor Mill MS. Fee required - \$25.00.**

Special Education Services

Students who have an active IEP will be provided resource assistance in the general education classes in which the students are enrolled.

Student Behavior

All students have a right to a safe learning environment. Expectations for student behavior are outlined in the *Student Handbook 2008-2009*. The policies in the handbook will be enforced during the summer program, on school grounds, on school buses, at school-sponsored activities, and off school property. Students who attend schools outside the BCPS system are responsible for adhering to the rules and regulations set forth in BCPS student handbook.

Summer School Attendance Policy

The standard BCPS attendance policy (see student's copy of BCPS *Student Handbook*) applies to all summer school students, which means that regular attendance is required in the summer program. Summer school students shall attend class unless prevented by illness, death in the family, or court related matters. Summer school students who miss 10% of a class unexcused will receive a failing grade for that class (2.4 days for classes that meet for 24 days or 1.2 days for Health and EPI). Summer school students in high school courses who miss as much as 20% of their class time, excused or unexcused, will receive a failing classwork grade. Arriving at school on time is very important to learning. Three latenesses will constitute one absence. Students whose attendance or punctuality do not meet the above requirements will be withdrawn from the summer school program after appropriate school contacts by phone or mail, counseling, and parent conferences.

Refund Policy

Requests for refunds must be made to the summer school office (*see front for contact information*) on or before July 7, 2009. Refunds will be mailed after July 30, 2009. **Refund requests made after July 7, 2009 will be denied.**

Transportation

Transportation for summer school will be provided by BCPS. Students will be picked up and dropped off at a BCPS school in their geographical area. Transportation information must be completed on the registration form. The *Summer School Transportation List* is available at your school or on the web at www.bcps.org/alted.

Report Cards

Students attending centralized summer school will receive a report card that will contain course grades and final exam grades. Summer school grades are not used to determine athletic eligibility for fall sports. **All** report cards are mailed on August 7, 2009.

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
