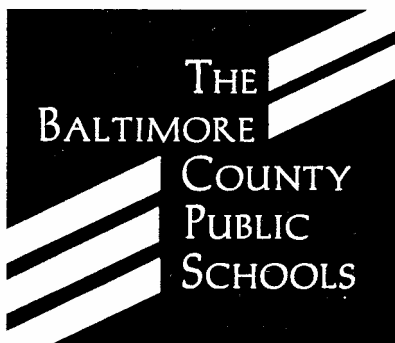

Plan for use:

The following is a plan and some suggested ways that we can incorporate the SAT essays in the CTE classes at Carver Center:

1. Use as a drill.
2. Use as homework that would be used to help them get the idea of critical thinking and initially not worry about time.
3. Ensure the students understand the rubric, so create a poster and post it.
4. Have students write a prompt and then have other students evaluate the work.
5. Bring together small groups of students to rewrite an essay with a score of 4 to bring it up to a score of 6.
6. Have the students type the rubric in business class.
7. Have the students rewrite their essays so they can attain a 6.

To ensure there is no repetition of prompts, the CTE teachers will collaborate with each other. Here at Carver most of the CTE subjects only have one teacher and only see their subject area students. So the only area that we need to ensure there is no overlap is Tech Ed and Business. Coordination and collaboration are key.

SAT Prompt #1

Think carefully about the issue presented in the following excerpt and the assignment below.

Albert Einstein said, “The most complex problems have the simplest solutions.” The avenues of student learning are processed in two domains, the Affective Domain and the Cognitive Domain. The Affective Domain concerns behavior, attitudes, and work ethics while the Cognitive Domain measures manual dexterity and scholastic achievement through testing. Formal studies have shown that student success in these two domains correlates to their success in career pathways.

Assignment: From your point of view as an employer, how would use the two domains to select and manage the proficiency of your workforce? Support your position with reasoning and examples taken from your reading, studies, experience, or observations.

Think carefully about the issue presented in the following excerpt and the assignment below.

1. Summative Assessments at the end of units
2. Formative Assessments at the end of teacher demonstrations
3. BCR

6. Part of the tests
7. Reflective journals

SAT Prompt #2

Consider carefully the following excerpt and the assignment below it. Then plan and write an essay that explains your ideas as persuasively as possible. Keep in mind that the support you provide – both reasons and examples – will help make your view convincing to the reader.

According to the National Institutes of Health, about 64% of Americans are overweight or obese. The obesity issue has ignited various debates and finger-pointing over who is responsible for this health crisis. Lawsuits against fast food chains, like McDonald's, lay the blame for an individual's weight gain on the door step of the restaurants themselves, who aggressively advertise, especially to young people, and offer a menu of fat-filled items guaranteed to make you "happy" and satisfied at a great price.

The other side of the debate is expressed in the following quote:

"Obesity has much to do with our own choices. Changing how we think about food would be a good first step toward improving how we eat, exercise, and take care of ourselves and those around us."

SAT Prompt #3

"Experiential education is based on the premise that for real learning to happen, students need to be active participants in the learning process rather than passive recipients of information given by a teacher. Interns tend not to be aware that experiential learning is considered a controversial form of education by some academics. SAT Prompt #6

Consider carefully the following excerpt and the assignment below it. Then plan and write an essay that explains your ideas as persuasively as possible. Keep in mind that the support you provide – both reasons and examples – will help make your view convincing to the reader.

The root of the word “technology” is the Greek word *tecknos*, which means “art.” Technology has been linked to art for centuries. For example, it took almost four years for Leonardo Da Vinci to paint the Mona Lisa, the most famous painting in the world. Today, it would take a graphic artist using a computer about five minutes to reproduce her. Howard Sparks, a well-known author of the 20th century, suggests that, “The art of our era is not art, but technology. Today, Rembrandt is painting automobiles; Shakespeare is writing research papers; Michelangelo is designing more efficient bank lobbies.”

The following is a plan and some suggested ways that we can improve the SAT essays by incorporating these ideas in the CTE at Perry Hall High School:

1. Our group discussed several ways to utilize prompts in our classes. One group thought they could use a prompt (either ones developed today or at a later date) at the start of each unit to determine student opinion and background on a topic.
2. It can be also used as an assessment piece, possibly even in a midterm, although that assignment needs to be directed to having students use information from a particular course in addition to their life experiences.
3. Lastly, we thought it could be a great lesson when the class has been shortened or altered because of an outside event (maybe a weather delay) or it can be used as an effective sub plan once you have done the activity in class to explain your criteria.
4. Our group also vocalized that it didn't matter if students saw the same prompt more than once (as long as it wasn't used on an exam) because the purpose of this activity is to improve their thinking and writing skills. It may force students to reexamine their examples and thoughts to improve their ideas.

- In order for the prompts to be used by the largest audience in the CTE department, we should share the prompts and decide which teachers will present specific prompts in their classes. Hopefully, this will limit redundancy.

- One way to avoid duplication of prompts is to view them as a group and assign certain prompts to certain teachers.
