Graphic/Print Communications Technology

The Graphic/Print Communications Technology program will provide students with the fundamental work place skills, technical application skills, and interpersonal skills necessary to enter and succeed in diverse careers associated with the graphic/print communications industry. Students will learn about artistic expression, computer operations, graphics and imagery software applications, machinery operation, desktop publishing, mechanical art, photography, camera equipment/digital electronic printing, image assembly, offset and letterpress processes, teamwork, problem solving, and communications skills necessary in today's modern graphic/printing communications facility. A partnership with Printing and Graphics Association Mid-Atlantic and the Community College of Baltimore County provides students with the opportunity to receive on-the-job training, earn national PrintED® certification, and/or earn articulated college credit.

NOTE: Students who qualify for Career & Technology Education magnet programs offered in schools in their geographic area are given priority in placement over students who reside in other areas of the county that offer similar programs.

Students who qualify for Career & Technology Education magnet programs not offered in schools in their geographic area are given the same consideration as other applicants.
