Academy of Finance (AOF) 2010-2011 Assessment Guidelines

The Academy of Finance (AOF) is a nationally recognized program and is affiliated with the National Academy Foundation (NAF.org). Completion of the Academy of Finance program of study helps prepare students for post-secondary education, not only in finance related majors, but also for any concentrated program requiring a strong foundation in business, social studies, mathematics, and language arts. There is a four-year sequence of study which offers upper level courses and provides the opportunity for students to enroll in a college-level finance course taught by college instructors during the senior year.

It is the parent's/guardian's responsibility to submit a complete application and a copy of all report card grades for the 2008-2009 school year.

Assessment reminders will be mailed to all eligible applicants.

Parents/Guardians of applicants who have NOT received notification at least five (5) days prior to the assessment date must contact the school to verify/schedule an appointment.

Academy Assessment: **January 12 & 13, 2010** *Assessments by Appointment*

Students with completed applications *will be invited* to the school to be *interviewed* and to write an essay *on-site* on January 12 or 13, 2010 between the hours of 3:30 - 5:30 p.m. All students will be contacted regarding a specific appointment date and time. Any applicant who has a scheduling conflict with another magnet school can receive an alternate time by contacting the schools directly.

Failure to attend an assessment WILL result in disqualification.

Inclement Weather: In the event that schools are closed due to inclement weather, weeknight magnet assessments will be postponed. Weekend magnet assessments will be postponed if the snow emergency plan is put into effect for Baltimore County. Postponed assessments will occur on the designated inclement weather date, January 19 & 20, 2010.

Academy of Finance (AOF) Assessment Information

On the Day of the Assessment The assessment takes approximately 45 minutes.

Students should be accompanied by at least one parent/guardian. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the scheduled time. Students will register for the audition in the front lobby. On average, the entire audition takes approximately 45 minutes. Parents may stay during the audition, or return to the school within 45 minutes. Seating will be available in the school for parents/guardians.

On the day of the assessment, applicants will participate in a personal interview and write a brief essay. It is recommended that students access the NAF.org Web site in order to become familiar with the Academy of Finance magnet program. For the written assessment, students will read and respond to a prompt, using writing skills learned in middle school. The written assessment may be either keyed on a computer or hand written. The interview and written responses will be scored using a standard rubric. Applicants may not take any notes or prepared responses into the assessment.

Please bring a blue or black ink pen to the assessment.

Applicants will be better prepared for the assessment phase (interview and essay) if they are able to respond to the following questions:

- What do you hope to gain from your participation in the Academy magnet program to which you applied and what will you be able to contribute to this program?
- What do you know about the Academy to which you applied? (This information can be obtained by attending the Lansdowne Open House and from the *NAF.org* Web site).
- What are the different types of materials that you read?
- What are the different types of activities in which you participate?
- What are your short-term and long-term goals?

Magnet Assessment Date

On January 12 & 13, 2010, all students will be required to attend the assessment held at Lansdowne High School. Students will be contacted with a specific date and time for the assessment. All students should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to their scheduled time. Students should be accompanied by at least one parent/guardian. (Inclement weather date: January 19 & 20, 2010)

Placement Prior to the Lottery

According to Superintendent's Rule 6400, *at the high school level where the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of available seats, up to 20% of the seats may first be filled with candidates who show exceptional commitment and promise in the specialized program as evidenced by their performance on the approved magnet assessment. The remaining seats will be filled using the centralized random lottery selection process from the remaining pool of qualified applicants.* Specifically, students who earn the highest combined scores on the written assessment and interview may fill up to 20% of the seats available in the magnet program.

Qualifying for Admission

The applicant must earn 80 points from the stated criteria in order to qualify for admission.

Convert your marking period grades to points (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, E=0). Then divide by the number of marking periods.
