The best way we support a healthy climate is providing high quality, engaging, and responsive instruction every day, in every classroom.

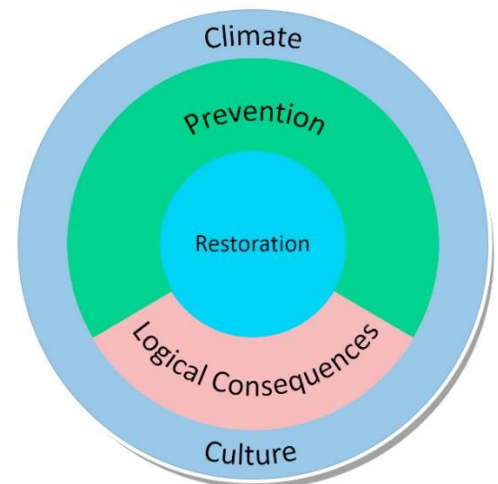
Prevention includes building positive relationships between students and adults.

When necessary, we provide **logical consequences** as guided by the BCPS Student Handbook, including reasonable, meaningful, and equitable responses to student behavior that hold students accountable and help them make different decisions in the future.

Prevention, restoration, and logical consequences all reinforce caring, relationship building, and student voice to support a positive school climate.
