The following contract recommendations are presented for consideration by the Board of Education of Baltimore County.

1. <u>Diplomas, Diploma Covers & Certificates</u> Estimated Award Value: \$23,000 One-Year Extension Contract #4 - 412-02

Abidforthepurchaseandprintin gofdiplomas, diplomacovers, and certificates was issued on December 6,2001, to seven vendors. Responses were received from two vendors. Award of contract was approved by the Board of Education on February 12,2002.

The bid specifications were design ed to provide a one -year extension of contract upon the request of BCPS. The award bid der has a greed to honoral pricing, terms, and conditions of the original proposal for the period of January 1,2003, through December 31,2003.

Extension of contract is recommended to **Jostens, Inc.**, **Redwing, MN**, in the estimated amount of \$23,000. Funding is to be provided by the Office of Student Data.

2. <u>LeasingPortableModularClassrooms</u> EstimatedAnnualValue:\$400,000 Five-yearContract EstimatedAwardVal ue:\$2,000,000 Contract#RHA -342-03

AttherequestoftheOfficeofMaintenance,afive -yearbidwasissuedon October31,2002, toobtainfirm -fixedpricingfortheleaseofportablemodular classroomsforuseatvariousschoolsites. Solicitationswe reissued to 22 vendors.andbidswerereceivedfromfourvendors. Theinitialagreementwill includea turn-keycombinationofon -sitefoundationwork,transportationtosite and setting in place of units, assembly and connection of units, installation of ramps, railings, and interior and exterior lighting, fees, permits, and licensing. All unitsshallbeincompliancewithTheAmericanswithDisabilitiesAct(ADA)and allfederalcodes, statecodes, firedepartment regulations and codes, NFPALife SafetyCodes, and local building codes for such use. The Officeof Maintenance willberesponsible for providing an appropriate area to setup the unit, connection of electricity, bells, intercom, networking into the units, and the extension of any sidewalks. The specifications were developed in conjunction with the Office of Maintenanceandthroughapre -bidmeeting.

ThetermsofthecontractshallremainineffectthroughOctober10,2007. PricingshallremainfirmthroughAugust31,2005.Afterthisd ate,itistheaward bidder'sresponsibilitytonotifytheOfficeofPurchasing,atleast90daysin advance,ofanychangeinpricingduetoincreasedfuelchargesormaterialcosts. BCPSreservestherighttoacceptorrejectapriceincreasewithin30 daysof beingnotified.Pricingcanonlybeadjustedbasedupontheincrease/decreasein thepriceoffueland/orcostofmaterialstotheawardvendor.BCPSalsoreserves therighttoterminatethecontractonanyorallitems,witha30 -daynotice,and to re-bid.

The solicitation required the bidders to provide separate pricing for each of the following:amonthlyrentalpriceforeachunit;costof deliveryoftheunittoan unobscuredsite; costofset -upoftheunitonthesite; costofinstalling skirtingon theunits; the price for ramps, steps, and handrails to meet or exceed code; and the pricefordisassemblyandremovalofunitsfromthesiteattheendofthelease. Theunitsbeingprovidedbythebiddersareexistingunitsownedbytheleasi ng company, and not custom - made units specifically designed as class room space. Sincetheneedsoftheschoolsystemareimpossibletopredict, and since the low biddermaynothaveunitsavailablewhenneeded, or in the quantity needed, the OfficeofPur chasingisrecommendingmultipleawardsofcontract. Allunits will beleasedforaninitialperiodofthreeyears, with the option without penalty to canceltheleaseaftersixmonths. The Office of Purchasing is recommending that threecompaniesofferingthemostfavorablepricingbased awardsbemadetothe uponthecomputedcostofathree -yearlease.

3. <u>Moving/RelocatingModularClassrooms</u> EstimatedAnnualValue:\$100,000 Five-yearContract EstimatedAwardValue:\$500,000 Contract#RHA -343-03

AttherequestoftheOfficeofMaintenance,afive -yearbidwasissuedon October31,2002,toqualifyandselectacontractor tomoveportablemodular classroomsfromonelocationtoanotherlocation, and to setup same. This is an indefinite quantitycontractwiththeawardbiddernotbeingguaranteedanywork. Solicitationswereissued to23vendors,andresponseswerereceivedfromtwo vendors,includingoneno -bid. Theinitialagreementwillincludethepermitsfor transportation and also the actual transportation of units to the site. The unbolting oftheunits, loading of the units, setting in place, assembly and connection of units, installation of ramps, railings, interior and exterior lighting, fees, permits, andlicensingwill betheresponsibilityofthe Officeof Maintenance. Additionally, the Office of Maintenancewillberesponsible for providing an appropriate are atoset up the unit, connection of electricity, bells, intercom, networking into the units, and the extension ofanysidewalks. **Thespecifications** werereviewedandrevisedinconjunctionwiththeOfficeofMaintenanceand throughapre -bidmeeting.

ThetermsofthecontractshallremainineffectthroughOctober10,2007. PricingshallremainfirmthroughA ugust31,2003.Afterthisdate,itistheaward bidder'sresponsibilitytonotifytheOfficeofPurchasing,atleast90daysin advance,ofanychangeinpricingduetoincreasedfuelcharges.BCPSreserves therighttoacceptorrejectapriceincrease within30daysofbeingnotified. Pricingcanonlybeadjustedbasedupontheincrease/decreaseinthepriceoffuel and/ormaterialstotheawardvendor.BCPSalsoreservestherighttoterminate thecontract,witha30 -daynotice,andtore -bid.

The solicitationrequired the bidderstoprovide a price for moving one unit (both halves). Phone call stotheven dors who did not bid indicated that these companies either were not interested in just transporting the trailers, or did not think they could be competitive with Equipment Transport's price because that is the subcontracting company they would call upon to do the actual move if they got the award. The Office of Purchasing is recommending that award be made to Equipment Transport, Baltimore, MD, offering the base-bid price of \$3,281 per move. This reflects a 15 percent increase in price from the previous bid is sued in 1999.

The estimated award value for this contract is \$100,000, annually, based upon historical moves of the seunits. Funding will be provided by the operating budgets of the Office of Maintenance and Capital Projects .
