Dr.Hairstonnotedthatoverthelastmonthorso,therehavebeennewspaperarticles with regardtopublishedtestscoresandtherelationshipastowhereweareheadedwithassessmentin MarylandandwithNoChildLeftBehind.KnowingthatMSPAPwasbeingphasedout,the schoolsystemhadtheoptionofadministeringthetestanddidso. Dr.Hairstonstatedthat MSPAPwasusedasadiagnostictool.Itprovidedanopportunityforindividualschoolstotake stockandreviewtheworkthathadbeendoneandtodointernalanalysis.Therewas misinterpretationthatscoresweredown.Dr.Ha irstonnotedthatnewassessmentswillbeused overthenext12years.HereassuredthepublicthatBaltimoreCountyPublicSchoolsisafine schoolsystemanditsperformanceasanorganizationisatitshighest.Dr.Hairstonstatedthe scoreswereneve rintendedtobeusedasarating.Heofferedhiscongratulationstoprincipals andteachersfortheirhardwork.

OLDBUSINESS

Mr.ArnoldannouncedtheBoardwouldtakeactionontheproposedrevisionstothe *BlueprintforProgress* onJanuary14,2003,sothatthepublicwouldhaveampletimetosubmi itscomments.Henotedthatnoonesignedupatthelastmeetingtoaddresstheproposed changes.

Mr.Kennedyquestionedwhysocialstudiesandsciencewerenotincludedinitemm)on page9.Ms.JohnsstatedundertheNoChildLeftBehindAct,wefi rstneedtofocuson improvingperformanceinreadingandmathematics.Itisbelievedthatifstudentscanreadand performinmathematicssuccessfully,theywilldowellinsocialstudiesandscience.

WithrespecttoPerformanceGoal1,Mr.Kennedyinq uiredifothercurricularareas wouldbeincluded.Ms.Johnsremindedeveryonethatthe *Blueprint*isaframeworkandthatthe importanceofothercurricularareasisnotbeingdiminished.Shestatedthatwhatwillbe requiredofthesystemforpublicrep ortingthroughtheMarylandSchoolAssessmentwillbe reading,languagearts,mathematics,andscience,initially.Ms.Johnsstatedthecommitteefeltit importanttomodelthedocumentafterNoChildLeftBehindandtheBridgetoExcellenceAct.

OLDBUSINESS(Cont.)

Mr.Teplitzkyaskedstafftoexplaintotheaudiencewhatthedocumentisandisn't.He notedthe *Blueprint*mightbethemostimportantdocument theBoardwillissue;however,it doesn'tlistprioritiesduringanyparticularyear.

Dr.Hairstonstateditisimportanttounderstandthisdocumentwasbornbasedonthe simpleconceptofcharacteristicsinaschoolthatanyparentwouldwanttheirchi ldtoexperience intheireducationalcareer.

Ms.Johnsstatedthatthedocumentistheoutlinefortheschoolsystem'svision,mission, beliefstatements,performancegoals,performanceindicators,andkeystrategies.Ms.Audette addedthatitisimportantforthe *Blueprint*toprovidetheframeworkfortheschoolsystem'sfive yearmasterplanthathastobesubmittedtotheStateDepartmentofEducation.Itmustalso alignwiththebudget.

Mr.Teplitzkystatedhelooksforwardtoseeingthepropose dbudgettieintothis document.Healsostatedthatit'simportanttogetmoreinformationtothepublicaboutthe resourcesincludedinth*Blueprint* soitwillbecleartothemwhatwearetryingtoaccomplish. Ms.Johnsrespondedthatoncethedocume ntisapprovedMr.Neilsonandhisstaffwillbeginto implementaplantoputthedocumentontheBCPSwebsiteaswellasdistributeittokey stakeholdergroups.SheassuredMr.Teplitzkythatthisdocumentanditsunderlyingresources wouldbeclearly communicatedtothepublic.

Ms.Ettingersuggestedthatthedocumentbeeffectivelycommunicatedwiththe teachers.Shestatedthatteachersneedtounderstandhowthisappliestothemandseeitasaway toachieve.

Mr.Kennedyquestionedtheest ablishmentofaminimumgoalforreading.Hefeltthat settingagoalof25booksmightdiscouragestudentsfromreading.Mr.Kennedysharedhis feelingthatwhiletheintentisgood,studentsshouldreadbecausetheyenjoytheactivity.

Dr.Haymanv oicedhisconcernaboutthelackofdiversityinthephotographsinthe document.WithregardtotheBeliefStatements,Dr.Haymansuggestedthat"will"inthefourth bulletshouldbechangedto"should."Healsosuggestedthat"must"wouldbeabetterw ordin thelasttwobulletsinsteadof"will."Dr.Haymanalsosuggestedaformattingchange.

Ms.Ettingerrequestedinformationonthepercentageofstudentsidentifiedwithspecial needsthatareconsidereddiplomaboundratherthanIMAPcandidates. Shealsoaskedatwhat pointthedecisionismadeastowhichpaththeyfollow.

Mr.Walkercommentedonthepublic'slackofresponsetothisdocument.Ms.Johns statedthislackofpubliccommentmightbebecauseofthestakeholdergroups'inputearly inthe process.

ThelastdocumentwastheManagementLetter.Mr.Teplitzkynotedthat alltheissuesraisedinpreviousyearshavebeencompleted orareinthe processofbeingaddressed.Anyissuesraisedinthisyear'sreportarein theprocessofbeingresolved.

Mr. Teplitzkyexpressedhisgratitudetostaffforworkingdiligentlyand cooperatively,andhethankedKPMGforitsworkthisyear. Ms.Burnopp alsothankedtheInternalAuditofficefortheirworkonthisproject.Mr. BoycesharedhisappreciationforthecooperationreceivedfromMs. Burnopp,Mr.Fannonandhisstaff,Ms.ParkerandtheInternalAudit office.

Mr.ArnoldandMr.T eplitzkypresentedsavingsbondstothestudents whoseworkappeared in the CAFR.

ReportonResidencyReview –Mr.Kemmery,ExecutiveDirectorfo r StudentSupportServices,reviewedthehistorybehindtheresidency investigation.ThroughaP owerPointTMpresentation,Mr.Rauenzahn, DirectorofStudentSupportServices,presentedtheresultsofthereview. Asaresultofthereview,tenstudentswerewithdrawnfromBaltimore CountyPublicSchools.

Mr.GrzymskinotedtheBoard'sresponsibility toassuretaxpayersthat theyarepayingfortheeducationofthosestudentswhobelongin BaltimoreCountyPublicSchools.Herequestedalistofthe13schools involvedintheinvestigation.Mr.GrzymskiexpressedhishopethatMr. Kemmery'sofficewo uldworkcloselywiththeExecutiveDirectorsof Schoolsinbeingmoreproactiveininvestigatingpossiblefraudulent enrollments,ratherthanwaitingforaschooltoseektheassistanceof StudentSupportServices.

Mr.Teplitzkyaskedforclarificationo fresidencyverificationdoneby schools.Mr.Rauenzahnstatedthatoftheapproximately16,500new studentstoBaltimoreCountyPublicSchoolseachyear,approximately 12,000areresidentstudentswhoareapprovedthroughdeed/lease documentation.Ther emainderarerequestingenrollmentbecauseof hardshipormultiplefamilylivingarrangements,whichhavetobe approvedbythePupilPersonnelOffice.

Mr.Teplitzkysharedhissurpriseofthelownumberofcasesreviewedin thisreport(411for13school s).Mr.Kemmerystatedthatthe13 principalswereaskedtosendhim <u>all</u>namesofquestionablecases.He notedthatBoardmemberswouldbesentthelistofschools,thenumberof casesreferredbyeachschool,andwhatwasfound.Dr.Ferguson, CoordinatorofPupilPersonnelServices,indicatedthatnamesarestill beingreferredtoMr.Kemmery'sofficeforinvestigation.Hesharedhis concerntherearepeoplewhomoveanddonotnotifytheschoolsothat thechildcanremaininthesameschool.

Mr.Ken nedynotedthatinsomecases,peoplewaittoolateinthesummer toregistertheirchildren.Heinquiredabouttheaccommodationsweare askingschoolstomaketoincreasepersonnelthelasttwoweeksbefore schoolsopen.Dr.Fergusonstatedthatstaff isavailablethroughoutthe summertoassistparents/guardians.Parents/guardians/socialworkersare encouragedtoenrollchildrenearly.Mr.Rauenzahnstatedduringthelast twoweeksofAugustandthefirsttwoweeksofSeptember,retiredpupil personnelworkersarehiredtoassistinreviewingcases.Thisyear,in
