[POLICY 4122

PERSONNEL: Professional

Temporary and Part-Time: <u>Student Teachers</u>

The school system assumes the obligation to provide apprentice teaching opportunities for student teachers from Maryland colleges and universities. Before entering into an agreement for student teaching with a Maryland college or university, the Superintendent of Schools shall ascertain that the institution will remunerate the cooperating (supervising) teacher in the form of tuition waivers or stipends.

A student teacher is defined as a teacher trainee, an observer or an intern. The Superintendent of Schools, principal, and teachers involved shall determine the number of trainees that shall be placed in the schools at any one time. Care shall be taken to see that no school or teacher is overburdened.
