### Policy Analysis for Board of Education Policy 6100 <u>Curriculum</u>

#### Statement of Issues or Questions Addressed

Board of Education Policy 6100 was revised in September 2007, but has not been substantially amended since its adoption in 1968. The policy is being revised with the recommendations to reflect current nomenclature language and essential components of the *Blueprint for Progress*.

<u>Cost Analysis and Fiscal Impact on School System</u> No fiscal impact is anticipated by the revision of this policy.

<u>Relationship to Other Board of Education Policies</u> Board of Education Policy 6000, *Instruction: Curriculum & Instruction;* Board of Education Policy 6002, *Instruction: Selection of Instructional Materials*.

#### INSTRUCTION

#### Curriculum

- I. Guidelines
  - The Board of Education OF BALTIMORE COUNTY (BOARD) IS A. COMMITTED TO PROVIDING **OPPORTUNITIES** FOR ALL STUDENTS TO LEARN AND [is committed to producing graduates who have the knowledge, skills, and attitudes] to reach their FULL potential as responsible, productive citizens[,to be successful in college and the work place, and to be] IN A DIVERSE SOCIETY. THE BOARD IS COMMITTED TO GRADUATING BALTIMORE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS' (BCPS) STUDENTS WITH THE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS THAT PREPARE THEM TO BE SUCCESSFUL PERSONALLY AND PROFESSIONALLY [competitive in the global economy.]
  - B. To accomplish [this vision] THE ABOVE GOALS, the Board [of Education recognizes that curriculum in Baltimore County Public Schools] INTENDS THAT THE BCPS CURRICULUM BE ROBUST AND RIGOROUS. THE CURRICULUM must prescribe[d for all grades and courses to identify what student should know and be able to do] THE APPROPRIATE courses of study FOR ALL STUDENTS FOR GRADES PRE-K THROUGH 12 INCLUDING THE ARTS, HEALTH, AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION. The Board affirms the need for THE articulation and coordination of curriculum across content areas and grade levels.
  - C. The Board RECOGNIZES THAT THE WRITTEN, TAUGHT, AND ASSESSED ASPECTS OF THE BCPS" CURRICULUM MUST BE ALIGNED TO MEET LOCAL, STATE, NATIONAL, AND **INTERNATIONAL STANDARDS** AND DEMONSTRATE INTERDISCIPLINARY COLLABORATION. FURTHERMORE, IT REQUIRES CONTINUOUS MONITORING AND REVIEW.
  - D. CURRICULA MUST BE DESIGNED TO INCREASE STUDENT PERFORMANCE BASED ON MEASURABLE OBJECTIVES. THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL DEVELOP RULES FOR THE DESIGN, PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT, DELIVERY, REVIEW, AND EVALUATION OF THE CURRICULUM TO IMPLEMENT THIS POLICY.

- E. THE BOARD DIRECTS THE SUPERINTENDENT TO USE AN ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM THAT WILL ASSESS THE PROGRESS OF EACH SCHOOL, THE EFFECTIVENESS OF EACH TEACHER, AND THE PROGRESS OF EACH STUDENT IN EACH COURSE USING THE SPECIFIC CRITERIA AND MEASURABLE OBJECTIVES [to be] SET FORTH IN THE CURRICULUM. THE BOARD DIRECTS THE SUPERINTENDENT TO ALLOCATE BCPS" SYSTEM-LEVEL SERVICES AND RESOURCES IN AN EQUITABLE, EFFECTIVE, AND EFFICIENT MANNER TO IMPROVE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.
- F. EACH SCHOOL IS ACCOUNTABLE FOR IMPROVING STUDENT LEARNING AND PROVIDING DIFFERENTIATED INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS THAT HELP ALL STUDENTS MOVE TOWARD HIGH STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE. RESULTS OF LOCAL, STATE, NATIONAL. AND INTERNATIONAL **TESTS** TO **MEASURE STUDENT** ACHIEVEMENT USING THE **APPROPRIATE** ACCOUNTABILITY STANDARDS WILL BE REPORTED TO THE PUBLIC WHERE APPLICABLE. DETAILED REPORTS OF STUDENT PROGRESS FOR EACH COURSE WILL BE PROVIDED TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS SHOWING NOT ONLY GRADES, BUT PROGRESS IN MASTERING THE OBJECTIVES OF EACH COURSE AS OUTLINED IN THE CURRICULUM

[Consistent with the goals outlined in this policy and the *Blueprint for Progress*, the superintendent shall devise standards or procedures for the design, delivery, and evaluation of the curriculum.]
