Description:

In response to the school system's goal to provide online information to all teachers, school administrators, and administrative staff regarding student performance, the purchase of the *testTrax* software package from EduTrax was approved by the Board of Education on November 21, 2000, and expanded on June 11, 2002, to include the *dataTrax* component. The contract that was originally approved is automatically renewable every year with the payment of the annual maintenance/service fee.

On September 19, 2006, the Board approved a second amendment to the original November 21, 2000, agreement with EduTrax, (JNI-760-07) adding the assessment component assessTrax®. The 2006 amendment included plans for a multi-year, phased implementation approach. The Web-based immediacy of *assessTrax*® makes it possible for teachers, principals, administrators, and other staff to administer assessments easily and to access and use the assessment results quickly to improve curriculum and instruction. Teachers view the results right after administering the assessments so that they can use the information to adjust their lessons and improve student achievement. Principals, department chairs, area office staff, and content office staff use the data to monitor the implementation of the curriculum, plan professional development, and target support to staff and schools. A variety of reports are available including individual student reports for parents/guardians.

This contract is for the continuing implementation of the systemwide short-cycle and benchmark assessment program. Short-cycle assessments assess student learning based on content area pacing guidelines. Benchmark assessments assess the broad scope of the state and local curriculum. BCPS-developed assessments are provided for English/language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies in Grades 3 through 10. The *assessTrax*® Web site provides online access to student, class, grade level, content area, school, and system-level results.

The purpose of this contract is to combine two existing contracts that are expiring soon into one new one which will consist of the purchase of supplemental reading resources and professional development for Title I schools, maintenance of reading research labs in Title I schools, maintenance and expansion of the 100 Book Challenge program, and individual school purchases that have been facilitated through the A&E grant and school operating budgets.

On February 14, 2006, the Board approved a contract with the American Reading Company to begin implementing the 100 Book Challenge as a limited pilot during the 2004-2006 school years at Mars Estates Elementary School. The 100 Book Challenge is a nationally-renowned program that complements current reading initiatives in BCPS. In addition to being an independent system, the 100 Book Challenge is also a professional development initiative and a parent support framework. It is currently used in more than 500 schools across the United States and has helped produce unprecedented improvements in student achievement. The pilot program was successful, substantially increasing the reading levels of many students involved in the program. The 100 Book Challenge program not only increases reading motivation and proficiency among students, it also actively engages parents and the community in the development, reinforcement, and enhancement of student literacy. For the school year 2006-2007, the Office of Equity and Assurance expanded the pilot program to the students at Winfield, Deer Park, Randallstown, Chase, and Pleasant Plains elementary schools, as well as continuing the program at Mars Estates. On June 12, 2007, the Board approved the expansion of the program for the school year 2007-2008 to include Halstead and Woodmoor elementary schools. On August 12, 2008, the contract was modified to expand the current program for the school year 2008-2009, to include 13 additional elementary schools at various grade levels at: Charlesmont, Chesapeake Terrace, Eastwood, Oakleigh, Orems, New Town, Perry Hall, Warren, Chapel Hill, Kingsville, Hampton, Padonia International, and Timonium elementary schools.

During FY08, an amendment request to reallocate funds to purchase a balanced reading initiative entitled *Reading Research Laboratories Project* (RRL) and corresponding professional development in Title I schools was approved by the Maryland State Department of Education. On August 25, 2009, the Board approved JNI-735-06 for the purchase of supplemental reading resources and professional development for FY10 Title I Schools. The customized professional development includes five days of professional development for classroom teachers, new-teacher training, and modules for instructional coaches. Initial implementation data indicates success with the RRL project substantially increasing the reading levels of many students involved in the program. Therefore, the Office of Title I would like to enhance this pilot project with the purchase of a takehome component and corresponding professional development for Title I instructional coaches and school-based staff. This purchase supports students' reading behaviors outside of the school and parent engagement in the educational process, two hallmark goals of *No Child Left Behind*. Further data collection and analysis will be conducted to measure project effectiveness in Title I schools enrolled in both programs; this is also required by the U.S. Department of Education for all grants.
