#### **Description:**

This contract will extend an online digital subscription, Defined STEM, that was purchased in the Summer of 2010 for a one-year trial period. The Office of Library Information Services (LIS) conducted the initial evaluation of Defined STEM with input from the other offices in the Department of STEM, and followed the software review protocols administered by the Office of Instructional Technology (OIT). Defined STEM provides users with a much-needed connection between STEM curriculum content/theory to their real-world applications. In addition, this digital resource shares video documentaries about STEM careers and offers additional educational resources such as supplemental lesson plans, interactive simulations, and performance-based learning tasks. Recent enhancements to Defined STEM include new content and literacy tasks that will help BCPS' STEM teachers assist with the transition to the new reading/language arts common core state standards.

The price for Defined STEM for 2011-2012 has increased, and BCPS is using this licensing agreement to stabalize its subscription rate for a four-year period from the date of the signed agreement through November 30, 2015, with payments to be made annually on an agreed-upon date. Defined STEM will service all teachers, students, and their families with the main emphasis on middle and high schools. BCPS' STEM offices have integrated Defined STEM into curriculum guides, and it has become a multi resource for curricula. Following professional development efforts on using this resource, usage of Defined STEM has increased dramatically. With a digital delivery system that all teachers, students, and families can access, it is expected that usage will continue to grow. The use of Defined STEM and other online digital resources marks a vast improvement from the time when the STEM curricula offices used to purchase the resources (tapes, DVDs, etc.) that had one person (teacher) access, incurred lost and cost issues, and was not accessible to all stakeholders, including parents.

#### **Description:**

This contract consists of nonpublic special education facilities providing special education services for students with disabilities that are approved by the Maryland State Department of Education. These facilities promote quality services for children and youth with disabilities only when the nature or severity of the disability is such that education in regular classes with the use of supplementary aides and services cannot be achieved. Under the *No Child Left Behind Act*, each public agency must ensure that a continuum of alternative placements is available to meet the needs of children with disabilities for special education and related services.

Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 13A.05.01.16 ensures that if a student's individual education program (IEP) cannot be implemented in a public county, regional, or state school program, the local school system shall take steps in accordance with Education Article, §§4-122, 8-401, and 8-409, Annotated Code of Maryland, to ensure that the student is provided with a free and appropriate education. These services must be provided at public expense, under public supervision and direction, at no cost to the parents. Nonpublic special education facilities must meet the standards of the state board regulations and the Individuals with Disabilities Act. Payment or reimbursement for a nonpublic program is provided through local and state funding.

The Office of Special Education currently works with approximately 35 day and residential nonpublic programs to ensure provision of services to students between 3 and 21 years of age who reside in Baltimore County. Each nonpublic program provides individualized educational services to meet the specialized needs of each learner (individualized program descriptions are available upon request). Each school provides support specific to meet the nature of the students they service. Some programs operate year round and provide extended school year or summer school programs when there is concern that a student may demonstrate recoupment or regression of skills.

When the nature or severity of a student's disability is such that an in-state program is not available, out-of-state programming must be considered. It is always the goal to return students to the least restrictive setting in order to provide them with opportunities to interact with their

typical peers. IEP review meetings are held throughout the year to reevaluate placement options and ensure that students are provided with a free and appropriate education in the least restrictive setting. BCPS nonpublic case managers work directly with nonpublic school programs to provide case management, professional development, consultation, and ongoing support to our students attending nonpublic programs.
