Two public information sessions scheduled this week to consider central and northeast middle school boundary options

Online survey access begins following meetings

What:

The Central and Northeast Area Middle School Boundary Study Committee will host two public information sessions this week to provide information and gather feedback about boundary options and the study process. The meeting will include an explanation of the process, a presentation of data, and a Gallery Walk of scenarios. The purpose of the boundary study is to establish an attendance area for the new northeast area middle school now under construction, to expand the attendance area for Pine Grove Middle School following completion of an addition that also is currently under construction, and to provide capacity relief to participating central and northeast area middle schools. Schools included in this study are Cockeysville, Dumbarton, Golden Ring, Middle River, Parkville, Perry Hall, Pine Grove, Ridgely, and Stemmers Run middle schools and Loch Raven Academy.
