Student artists honored at 35th Annual High School Art Exhibition

Exhibition at The Startup at Towson University remains on view through June 15

TOWSON, MD. – Many of Baltimore County Public Schools' best student artists were honored for their work and talent during a June 1 reception and awards ceremony for BCPS' 35th Annual High School Art Exhibition. The juried exhibition featured 114 pieces of art representing the work of 117 student artists from across the county.

Following the ceremony at The Startup at Towson University, the student artwork will be on display between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Thursday, June 15, 2023.

"Students have created incredible artwork throughout the year, and this exhibition is an opportunity to showcase the best student work from each high school in Baltimore County," said Ryan Twentey, coordinator of the BCPS Office of Visual Art. "We also are excited and proud to thank our new partner, Towson University, for their support and use of The Startup, formerly the historic Towson Armory."

Once this exhibition has completed at The Startup, the artwork will travel to other venues for up to a year.
