2023 BCPS Film Expo honors 10 projects from 8 schools

Projects available online for public viewing

Towson, MD – What do drinking tea, being on the run, life as a slug, a horticulture class, and a daily routine have in common? They were just some of the subjects explored by the award-winning student films showcased at the 2023 BCPS Film Expo.

Held on May 16 at The Senator Theatre, the BCPS Film Expo is Baltimore County's largest student film competition. In its eighth year, the competition attracted 148 film and GIF entries from 27 schools, including the Virtual Learning Program. Ten films were selected as favorites by the competition judges and were awarded prizes. These 10 films can be viewed online.
