13 BCPS students earn medals at annual Baltimore NAACP ACT-SO competition

Seven gold medalists qualify to compete at national level

Towson, Md. – Thirteen Baltimore County Public Schools students earned 21 medals in the Baltimore NAACP ACT-SO competition. The seven BCPS students who have earned gold medals are now eligible to compete at the national level, where they might earn scholarships and other rewards. The national competition will be held in July in Boston.

All the students honored with medals or honorable mentions attend George Washington Carver Center for Arts and Technology unless otherwise noted.

ACT-SO, the Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological and Scientific Olympics, is a yearlong, youth enrichment program sponsored by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). High school students of African descent compete in one or more of 27 categories related to the sciences, humanities, business, and visual and performing arts.
