Central Area Elementary School Capacity Relief Boundary Study group to host 2 public information meetings

Livestreamed meetings on Nov. 15, 16, to consider options, hear feedback

What:

The committee charged with examining central area elementary school attendance areas will host two public information sessions to provide information and gather public feedback about boundary option preferences and the study process. Both meetings will cover identical information, including an explanation of the process, a presentation of data and map options, and opportunities to provide feedback.

The study seeks to evaluate boundary options and relieve schools projected to be overcrowded, as well as to maximize the use of available space at elementary schools in the region. The study's scope includes 19 central-area elementary schools.

Background: Schools participating in the study are Carroll Manor, Cromwell Valley Regional Magnet, Halstead Academy, Hampton, Jacksonville, Lutherville Laboratory, Mays Chapel, Oakleigh, Padonia International, Pine Grove, Pinewood, Pleasant Plains, Pot Spring, Rodgers Forge, Riderwood, Stoneleigh, Timonium, Warren, and West Towson elementary schools.
